Maryland US&R TF Team Responds to Oklahoma City

On April 19, 1995, a bomb rocked the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City and shook the nation with the horror of that disaster in human terms.

Within hours, Lt. Tom Carr, the task leader of the Maryland Urban Search and Rescue Task Force (US&R TF), flew out to the bomb site at the request of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to serve on an incident support group. He was joined at the scene by other US&R TF management personnel from around the county.

Recognizing the magnitude of the disaster, FEMA mobilized 11 of the 26 US&R TF teams nationwide to help in the effort, including the one headquartered in Montgomery County. The 56-member team

rushed to Andrews Air Force Base, where waiting military aircraft whisked them away to Oklahoma, arriving within 24 hours of the blast.

Because FEMA asked Lt. Carr to serve a managerial role in this disaster, the team's assistant task leader—Lt. Robert (Doc) Holliday—assumed Carr's usual responsibilities along with Asst. Chief Monty Fitch, of the Montgomery County Department of Fire and Rescue Services (MCDFRS). All three men belong to MCDFRS, as well as participate on the state's US&R TF team.

Upon landing at the Tinker Air Force Base, the team was immediately briefed on the situation and transported to the bomb site. Putting in 12-hour shifts, the team spent the following nine days helping the other US&R TF teams and local emergency

personnel to complete the arduous task of clearing away the rubble left by the explosion and the anguishing task of searching for survivors beneath the debris.

The cleanup involved shoring up the weak parts of the structure, lifting concrete slabs out of the way, breaking and breaching building materials, and then removing debris. The Maryland US&R TF team spent most of its time in what was called the "pit area." That was the part of the building to the right of the opening (when facing the building), where the day care center and credit union were located.

The hardest part of the ordeal, according to Lt. Holliday, was not the physical labor involved in shoring up the weak sections of the remaining structure or in moving heavy concrete slabs out of the way, but the sorrow of not finding many survivors.

"You never gave up hoping," says Lt. Holliday. "But as the days went by, we realized that the chance of finding anyone alive was getting slim," he continued. Looking on the bright side, however, Lt. Holliday adds: "By finding all but three of the victims, we helped bring closure to this horrible incident for their families and friends."

"This [incident] was the first utilization of Montgomery County's team outside of Maryland," says Assistant Chief Ed Bickham, of MCDFRS. "It allowed the team to fully test equipment and procedures that have been in place for more than five years for [handling] major incidents," he adds. According to Lt. Holliday, everything worked well.

Continued from page 1 them are fully operational, says Lt. Holliday, meaning that they have all of the equipment and highly trained personnel, as well as a management system, required to respond to a major catastrophe. The Maryland US&R TF is one of those 15 teams, and was among the 11 teams that FEMA called into action in Oklahoma.

The Maryland US&R TF team was organized with the Rockville Volunteer Fire Department in 1989 to respond to such disaster incidents, including trench and building collapses, confined space incidents, and mass casualty incidents resulting from such catastrophic events as hurricanes, tornados, and earthquakes. Although based in Montgomery County, the Maryland US&R TF team serves the

surrounding counties. And when a national disaster strikes, the team can be called into action by FEMA, as was the case in the Oklahoma bombing.

The team is a combination of career and volunteer emergency personnel and civilian personnel.

Included on the team are fire fighters, paramedics, physicians, and experts in search and rescue operations, heavy rigging, structural engineering, logistics, hazardous materials, and communications. The search specialists use electronic, as well as canine, methods to locate victims. The rescue specialists, on the other hand, are trained in shoring, lifting, cutting, and breaking through all types of building material.

All of the team members are highly trained in their specialties and are cross-trained in at least one other specialty. On-duty team members attend weekly training sessions, and the full team meets on a quarterly basis to receive training. Camden Yards was one of the training sites for the team members. They practiced their skills in the buildings that were being demolished to make room for Baltimore's new stadium.

Aeromedical Committee Report

In response to one of the legislative mandates of the EMS Board, Donald L. DeVries, EMS Board chairman, named Chief John Frazier to chair a Joint Aeromedical Committee. Three issues were addressed by the committee: should the Maryland State Police (MSP) charge for aeromedical transports; what should be the medical role of the MSP helicopters in the overall statewide EMS system; and what should be the configuration for the medical complement on MSP Med-Evac helicopters.

The EMS Board approved the recommendations of the aeromedical committee in August. Included in these recommendations were the following.

The committee recommended that the EMS system not charge for aeromedical transports at the present

time and that the EMS Board and Finance Subcommittee begin to identify funding sources for replacing the Med-Evac fleet following their "useful" life of approximately 10 years.

The EMS Governing Board strongly supports the continuation of the triple mission of the MSP helicopters: Med-Evac, search and rescue, and law enforcement. They stated that the primary Med-Evac mission of the MSP helicopters in the overall EMS mission is "to provide rapid transport and care of the patient with a time critical illness/injury from the scene or the hospital emergency department to an appropriate treatment facility. The secondary role of the MSP helicopters, when no other appropriate service is available, will include the interhospital transport of patients whose transfer to another facility is deemed medically necessary

and whose time out of hospital may negatively impact their ultimate outcome."

Regarding the medical complement configuration, the aeromedical committee stated that it should "ideally be comprised of a pilot, a primary provider who is a sworn State Trooper certified as a Maryland Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic with 'extended skills,' and a second provider who is a sworn State Trooper certified as a Maryland Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic." The committee also recommended that sources for additional funding for a second sworn state trooper be explored. Regarding the secondary Med-Evac mission of critical care transports, the committee recommended that a system be in place by which an appropriately trained critical care provider can be picked up to assist with the transport.

222 twin-engine helicopter. The Team Flight™ crew includes a critical care registered nurse and a nationally registered paramedic.
