#### Garrett County Activities

Garrett Regional Medical Center - Kim Gordon

- Shelby Dilly is now our full-time Base Station Coordinator.
- Amber Ganoe is the new Director for the ED and ICU.
- A Base Station course was held recently; she thanked Jeff Hobbs from UPMC WMD for his help.
- Thanked all of Garrett County EMS who have helped them tremendously whenever there have been some extremely critical patients who needed transport. They have helped us several times and we greatly appreciate it.
- The hospital will have a ground crew that will be available to them 24/7 and will be housed on the Garrett Regional Medical Center campus with an ALS crew.

Garrett County Emergency Services & Emergency Services Board - Sam Grant; Emergency Manager

- Derek Crippen has been selected as the new EMS Chief for the County; he started this past week.
- Dr. Rikhye, our Medical Director officially resigned his position today. Dr. Martin has very graciously stepped up to be interim for us until we're able to get a new Medical Director in place. We're hoping to move forward quickly on that process.

#### Garrett County Emergency Management & Communications- Justin Orendorf

• The backup 911 Center project is underway; getting equipment ordered now. Hopefully, in six to eight months from now we'll have that project finished.

#### Garrett County Health Department - Lori Peck

- The last COVID clinic has been finished at the Health Department, but COVID vaccinations are available and anyone
  can call and set up an appointment to schedule one. COVID testing still is available with the HD at this time and we
  have free over the counter COVID tests at the libraries and in the hallways of the HD.
- Their Health Officer, Bob Stevens, is set to retire at the end of April. There is a job application on the website.

Allegany County Emergency Management / Communications

• The new CAD should be up soon; go live date is in February.

### Allegany County Emergency Services Board - Scott Whetsell

• There's been some discussion about updating the ambulance alert and response policy. The EMS Chiefs Subcommittee met in the last couple weeks and came up with the latest revision draft to go in, so that's has to be voted on. The Emergency Services Board has a meeting next month.

## <u> Allegany County EMS</u> – Mike Salvadge

- We have been approved for RSI; are in the final stages of getting that program wrapped up and started. We will have two units within the county that will have the RSI stuff on them and a portable vent on each; the unit that's stationed in LaVale also will have RSI capability.
- One of our big pushes from our Resuscitation Academy is trying to find a way to get AEDs in all the patrol cars for the police departments. We're in the planning stages of trying to get that off the ground. Biggest hurdle we're going to have is the annual training of CPR to 10% of the County population.
- We're developing a peer support group within the department and it will be open to all providers in the county. It is not going to deal with system things. It's going to be for people to get help with things such as the aftermath of events or any kind of problem that people may be dealing with and want to talk to someone about.

## Allegany County Health Department - Allison Robinson

- The HD is looking for a new Health Officer. Dr. Junie Delizo resigned a couple of months ago. So, unfortunately, we only had him for about four months before he resigned. They have changed things up a little bit for the position and are also looking at individuals with a public health background, but have a bachelor's degree.
- Are in the process of revamping all of our Plans.
- We are still doing COVID testing and still handing out tests.
- The HD is getting the Family Planning Program back in Allegheny County again

## **Regional Reports**

Regional Medical Director – Dr. Janelle Martin

- She formally thank Dr. Rikhye for all his years of service to Garrett County as the Garrett County EMS Medical Director.
- One of the biggest issues is the respiratory virus season that we are in the middle of now. Maryland's
  hospitalizations for COVID, influenza, RSV and all other respiratory viruses are significant. We may be pulling out of
  the very, very high volume right now. She is encouraging all EMS to pay attention to PPE; would very strongly
  recommend employing universal face masking for all clinicians and patients as tolerated during patient encounters,
  but specifically for respiratory viruses or respiratory symptoms. Most Healthcare facilities have requested universal
  masking, too.
- There are multiple changes for protocol that will be going into effect in the summer. There's actually quite a few of them.

## Medevac - Rick DeVore

- The 2023 numbers for whole blood use by the Command: The Aviation Command transported 63 patients and administered 77 units.
- Right now, obviously with winter and the weather here, Trooper 5 may not always be able to get to you with the aircraft. However, we have a medic at the section, even if we are down for the weather. So, if you guys on the ground feel like blood or RSI is a potential, by all means request us and we can head your way VIA ground.
- Recently, the Command announced annual awards. Two of the awards, Pilot of the Year and Non-commissioned Officer of the Year were both members from Trooper 5.

 Right now is the time to gets something scheduled for springtime, if any Departments want to do demos or training, so that we can start planning and do some outreach and go from there. If anybody has any questions, feel free to reach out to me.

#### <u>CISM</u> – Al Ward

- No calls for service since the last Council meeting.
- The ICISF is now offering the basic course for CISM members online If anybody's interested in doing that, there's a couple of them coming up in the spring. You can check with their website on the dates and the costs and everything and then get with me for an application and we'll go from there.
- As always we're here 24/7, call us if you need us.

AGCVFRA – Jonathon Dayton was unable to attend, but emailed an update to members.

- The legislative session is upon us. If you want to track fire and ems legislation, I would encourage you to sign up for the Maryland State Firemen's Association weekly updates.
- As for the AGCVFRA, we have suspended the relief fund for 2024 until we can find and agree upon a solution for financial sustainability.
- The next meeting is at Bowman's Addition on February 11th.

Region I & II Healthcare Coalition - Colin Graham

- He is the new Regions I & II Coordinator
- They have the new Link systems.
- We purchased Stop the Bleed new trainers and supplies from Rescue Essentials; with both laceration and gunshot wound. We're getting about 300 gallons of simulated blood (the powder form) and we're buying about a thousand fold combat gauze for the trainers. As always, if you are doing training, just reach out to us if you need something.

Career Fire & EMS – Chief Adams

- It's been a little busy for the last couple weeks. We've had to have the County come in and handle some calls; they've been backing us up. Trying to keep an ambulance on the streets as quick as we can.
- As of a couple weeks ago, we became fully staffed again.
- We are in the process of going to new priority dispatching with the County.

# Garrett College ALS Training report for Region 1 EMS Advisory Council

January 18, 2024 - 1900 hours online

<u>2022-2024 cohort</u> – The cohort is in its last semester. We retain 20 students. This will be a busy semester as they complete their capstone and other clinicals requirements. The last day of class will be May 7<sup>th</sup>. NREMT psychomotor testing is scheduled for May 18<sup>th</sup>. Graduation is set for Tuesday, May 14<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. in the Garrett College Performing Arts Conference room. The Council is invited.

**Paramedic accelerated hybrid** –This cohort has 9 students. One withdrew due to time, and one failed the fall semester due to clinicals. They meet on Wednesdays from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. for inperson lecture review and skills. All lecture content is online. Following the capstone clinical time, graduation is expected in the first part of September 2024. This cohort will only have the NREMT written exam with no psychomotor.

**Fall 2024 cohort** – Applications for the 2024-2026 two-year evening program, and the 2024-2025 daytime hybrid program will open March 1. If interested, contact us to get on the interest list and begin that conversation.

<u>Accreditation</u> – Our 5-year reaccreditation is underway. We completed our self-study and have already received our Executive Analysis. Our site visit is expected in July – December of 2024.

<u>Health Sciences partnerships</u> – Partnerships between Garrett, Allegany, Potomac State, and Eastern West Virginia Community & Technical College continue with the paramedic program being the first program to collaborate on.
