Re: <u>ALS Protocol Orientation Replaces Protocol Exam</u>

I am excited to announce the launch of the MIEMSS ALS Protocol Orientation in the Maryland EMS Online Training Center. Effective immediately, this online training program replaces the ALS protocol exam as a requirement for Maryland paramedic licensure.

I believe this new program will significantly enhance knowledge of the *Maryland Medical Protocols for Emergency Medical Services* for new paramedics. Also, it will preclude the need to schedule in-person testing or conduct jurisdictional protocol review sessions. The orientation program is organized into eight modules, which can be completed at the participant's own pace. Candidates for a Maryland paramedic license will complete the following process:

- Complete the online application at <u>www.miemsslicense.com</u> for paramedic licensure.
- MIEMSS will verify that the candidate has active status as a National Registry Paramedic.
- Complete the Maryland Medical Protocol Orientation for ALS Clinicians in the Online Training Center (<u>www.emsonlinetraining.org</u>).
- The completed Protocol Orientation will appear on the candidate's MIEMSS transcript within 10-14 days.
- Once the application and record of completion of the Protocol Orientation have been received, the application will be sent to the candidate's EMS Operational Program and Medical Director for approval.
- Once EMSOP and medical director approval have been received by MIEMSS, the application will be processed and a license will be issued.

MIEMSS will maintain the existing ALS protocol exam as an option for paramedic licensure candidates until December 31, 2020. Please contact Melissa Meyers, ALS Program Manager (<u>mmeyers@miemss.org</u>) if you have any questions.
